The glamorous evening featured music by the talented Tango ensemble, Quinteto Leopoldo Federico, whose debut album "Bogotá—Buenos Aires" was recorded at Florida's very own Florida Atlantic University's Hoot/Wisdom Recordings and was produced by the Commercial Music Program in the Department of Music at FAU's Dorothy F. Schmidt College of Arts and Letters. The album, a fusion of Argentinian tango and Colombian folk rhythms, received a GRAMMY nomination in the "Best Tango Album" category at the Latin GRAMMY Awards®.
